It is my privilege to introduce this combined 2019/2020 Annual Report in my capacity as Secretary-General of EUCLID, having taken office in July 2020.

Much gratitude is due to founding Secretary-General Syed Zahid Ali for his tremendous achievements over the past 12 years.

As the numbers indicate, 2019 and 2020 were very dynamic and successful years for EUCLID globally, in spite of the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic.

EUCLID continued to develop its institutional links by achieving the status of formal Party in the International Anti-Corruption Academy (IACA), a fellow intergovernmental institution headquartered in Austria.

A cooperation agreement was also signed with EISVM, another intergovernmental institution of higher learning headquartered in Senegal.

Throughout 2019 and 2020, EUCLID continued to focus on internal and international quality assurance processes, working with NAQAA in The Gambia, ANAQAES/Ministry of Higher Education in the Central African Republic, and recently with ATHEA (a private ENQA affiliate) in Austria.

A significant development in 2020 was for EUCLID to receive the official status of Social Actor in the Association of Caribbean States with the aim of developing concrete partnership initiatives in the region.

I take this opportunity to congratulate and thank all EUCLID stakeholder who are contributing to make our institution a global leader in online higher education. EUCLID is more than an institution, it is a shared vision.

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, online education has become the “new normal.” As an institution specialized in online, open and distance learning since its early inception in 2006-2007, EUCLID was well prepared to deal with a challenging new global environment.

EUCLID introduced a new proctored testing platform (Proctorio on Moodle) in 2019 and a new MOOC system (LearnDash on WordPress) in late 2020.

Our commitment remains to build on the triple foundation of (1) outstanding technology (2) highly relevant content, and (3) dedicated faculty.

A EUCLID OVERVIEW

Initiated in 2004 and formalized in 2008, EUCLID is a remarkable global institution.

It is both a university and an intergovernmental organization.

Under our “intergovernmental organization” mandate, we provide important support services to our Participating States, including consultancy and e-government support.

Under our “intergovernmental university” mandate, we offer distance-learning programs in specific areas that correspond to our area of competencies. In doing so, we rely on an amazing faculty team which makes EUCLID a truly international university. Most of our instructors also work for other institutions and are willing to bring their expertise to contribution.

It is important to stress that our priority is to deliver flexible and recognized graduate-level programs to the staff of our Participating States. These are distance-learning programs that are built on the work accomplished by the Euclid Consortium in 2006 and 2007, and which led to the constitution of EUCLID as an intergovernmental university in 2008.

Our secondary priority is to support our Participating States in other areas where EUCLID has achieved competency and capacity, especially in e-government services.

Finally, EUCLID is authorized to allow general public students (notably from priority areas) to enroll in its programs, primarily for funding reasons. The number of general public students (who pay tuition) is determined to match both our faculty availability as well as our funding needs. At this point, it should also be

said that our general public students are often diplomats or staff members for non-EUCLID States and intergovernmental organizations.

In general, our goal is to serve 5-15 government-sponsored students (we call them “participants” rather than students) per Participating State during one cycle. In some cases, our services to our Participating States are more focused on support services than on education—the key idea is that EUCLID is the creature of its constitutive text and supporting governments. It does not exist for itself but to be of service to its sponsoring governments and to the international community.

This dual aspect is more an asset and a strength than a liability, but we have found it necessary to engage in an educational effort to explain what intergovernmental universities are all about and how EUCLID is rightly structured to deliver on its mandate.

An amazing aspect of our organization is the interconnection between its African roots, its global faculty and management team, and the share of work being delivered by dedicated volunteers serving from all continents. Few “international universities” are as truly international as EUCLID is, and this is a source of inspiration and ever-renewed energy to excel.

EUCLID IN NUMBERS: 2019-2020

Although the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic had a temporary negative effect on operations, applications, and enrollment level, 2019 and 2020 indicate ongoing growth in global interest. However, the tremendous increase in number of online education providers is making online visibility an ongoing challenge.

2019:

1178 applications received in CMS in 2019

(compared to 919 applications in 2018)

182 new students from 64 countries

405 courses started, of which 117 courses were completed in the same year

166 total courses completed in 2019 regardless of Start Date

2020:

1492 applications received in CMS

(compared to 1178 applications in 2019)

187 new students from 59 countries

668 courses started, of which 266 courses were completed in the same year

424 total courses completed regardless of Start Date

UPDATE ON MEMBERSHIPS AND PARTICIPATIONS

EUCLID is unique and remarkable among institutions of higher learning by the breadth and relevance of its global engagement through partnerships and affiliations. 2019 and 2020 saw another leap forward for EUCLID in terms of international and intergovernmental developments, culminating with the announcement of an MOU with ACS to be signed early 2021.

EISMV

In 2019, EUCLID signed a partnership agreement with a fellow intergovernmental institution of higher education called the *École Inter-États des Sciences et Médecine Vétérinaires* based in Dakar, Senegal. Both institutions share member states as well as areas of expertise in global health and a new discipline called "One Health."



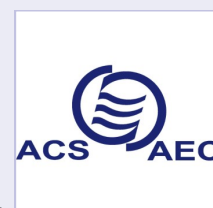
IACA

In 2020, EUCLID formally acceded to the legal status of Party in the International Anti-Corruption Academy, an intergovernmental institution of higher learning based in Laxenburg, Austria. EUCLID's participation was registered by the government of Austria in the records of the United Nations Treaty Series. EUCLID and IACA officials held conference calls on area of possible cooperation in online education.



ACS

In 2020, EUCLID formally applied to obtain the status of Social Actor in the Association of Caribbean States, which requires the agreement of the Ministerial Council of its 25 Member States. This application was duly approved, paving the way for continued cooperation between the two intergovernmental organizations.



ATHEA

In 2020, EUCLID applied for and was approved for institutional membership in the Association for Transnational Higher Education Accreditation (ATHEA), Vienna, Austria. ATHEA is an approved third party agency for additional accreditation under the terms of EUCLID's headquarters agreement. ATHEA is an International Affiliate of ENQA. EUCLID is also an affiliate member of INQAAHE.





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EUCLID/MBAs: INTERGOVERNMENTAL BUSINESS EDUCATION

EUCLID is continuing to update and reenergize its business education programs to meet the needs of its intergovernmental stakeholders and partners. A new logo and website, new majors including Digital Economic Transformation, a proof of concept entrepreneurship project are all part of this dynamic aspect of EUCLID's sustainability mandate.



EUCLID infused new life and practicality to its MBA programs by introducing a new logo and major web site update. The EUCLID MBA team also launched a "proof of concept" project in global entrepreneurship by supporting and fully documenting the creation and launch of a new international company and brand named SwissCorps.

There is a clear upward symbolism inherent in the logo. From the baseline, which forms the solid base, the lines develop increasingly upwards. Thus the symbol expresses the transformation of the students to highly proficient expert leaders.
Your Life Transformed
The triangle as outer form is perfectly suited as a symbol for leadership.



In geometry, an equilateral triangle is a triangle in which all three sides have the same length. In the familiar Euclidean geometry, an equilateral triangle is also equiangular; that is, all three internal angles are also congruent to each other and are each 60° . It is also a regular polygon, so it is also referred to as a regular triangle.



The lines come from different sides and meet in one point, reflecting the academic motto of EUCLID: *"Let us also hear the other side"* (*"Audi et alteram partem"*). At the same time, the development from one point out into different directions is also visualized: *"Become Globalized"*.



Euclid's fifth postulate:

If a line segment intersects two straight lines forming two interior angles on the same side that sum to less than two right angles, then the two lines, if extended indefinitely, meet on that side on which the angles sum to less than two right angles.



The logo is built in exact corresponding levels, which symbolizes a constructive and solid development:
Rigor, good faculty support, real transformation of abilities and knowledge from start to finish.






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EVENTS AT THE BANGUI HQ

Over the course of the year 2019 and 2020, a number of important events took place at the EUCLID Bangui headquarters located at Avenue de France within the ENAM compound. EUCLID welcomed the arrival of the new ENAM Director General and continued to support ENAM operations.



EUCLID organized two graduation ceremonies at its Bangui headquarters, one for Minister of Foreign Affairs Charles Doubane (left on photo) who presented his dissertation on intergovernmental education, and one in 2020 for a director of the ministry of foreign affairs, Joseph Assana (second from left). The latter presented his dissertation, supervised by Pr Ludovic Chan-Tung, on a specific treaty case ("*Cas de Code CEMAC*").

Throughout both years, EUCLID worked closely with the Ministry of Higher Education of the Central African Republic, notably with Director General Josias Tebero, on the development and finalization of quality assurance processes at the university level, along with the establishment a new quality assurance agency called ANAQAES.

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EVENTS AT THE GAMBIA HQ

EUCLID hired a full-time Vice-Chancellor posted at its Gambia headquarters and appointed its long-time Director as Registrar (acting).

This HQ is of strategic importance in view of EUCLID's relationship with ECO-WAS both as an institution and a region.

JANUARY 2019:

On the 31st of January 2019, the EUCLID Oversight Council Chairman and International Faculty Coordinator, Pr Laurent Cleenewerck, visited The Gambia to discuss important issues regarding the continued operation of EUCLID in the country. Pr Cleenewerck met with the Minister for Higher Education (photo, right) and his staff, as well as with the NAQAA CEO Dr Jibril Jaw. The results of the meeting culminated in the production of 6 actionable recommendations.

JUNE 2019:

EUCLID dispatched an official correspondence to NAQAA providing updates on the implementation of the MoHERST/NAQAA Recommendations. Draft advertisements (with special focus on the qualifications and experience requirements) for the positions of EUCLID Vice Chancellors and Registrar were shared with the NAQAA. Adverts were published in major national newspapers in July and ran for 2 weeks. In the same report, EUCLID provided information and justification for the selection of Proctorio to deliver fully proctored online the examinations. With regards to one of the recommendations (01), EUCLID officially adopted the motto "Intergovernmental Excellence in Online Learning" now posted on the header of its official websites and letter-head.

AUGUST 2019:

The EUCLID Gambia HQ staff participated in a NAQAA organized training on Quality Assurance for Personnel of Higher Education Institutions (HEIs). The 3 days training program (20th – 22nd August) which was funded by the UNESCO – SHENZHEN Project on Quality Assurance, took place at the NAQAA Conference Hall. EUCLID also applied for and secured membership in AfriQAN (African Quality Assurance Network) and INQAHE (International Network for Quality Assurance Agencies in Higher Education).



OCTOBER 2019:

Dr Amadou S. Camara assumed office as EUCLID Vice Chancellor on October 1, 2019. His appointment was in response to MoHERST/NAQAA Recommendation 4 to have a qualified EUCLID Vice Chancellor to be stationed at the Gambia Headquarters permanently.

On the 28th October 2019, EUCLID delivered another update letter to the NAQAA regarding the implementation of recommendations. The letter announced the appointment of Mr Winston Dookeran as "EUCLID Under-Secretary-General with a portfolio in global partnership development as well as regional representation. Mr. Dookeran previously served as Central Bank Governor, Minister of Finance and Minister of Foreign Affairs in Trinidad and Tobago. Mr Dookeran also serves as Professor of Practice at the University of the West Indies." On the 31st October 2019, EUCLID completed and submitted the NAQAA Academic and Administrative Staff Census questionnaire.

FEBRUARY 2020:

On the 17th February, the EUCLID Vice Chancellor, Dr Amadou Camara paid a courtesy call visit to the Chief Executive Officer of the National Accreditation and Quality Assurance Authority (NAQAA), Dr Gibril Jaw. The main purpose of the visit was to formally introduce the new EUCLID VC to the NAQAA CEO and his staff, as well as provide an update on the implementation of the 6 NAQAA Recommendations.

MAY 2020:

Due to the coronavirus pandemic which led to a lockdown, many Gambian businesses were affected. EUCLID University as part of humanitarian contributions to supplement and complement national relief response efforts, donated 30 bags of rice to poor people living around the Brusubi Turntable area where EUCLID is headquartered.

VICE-CHANCELLOR BIOGRAPHY

Dr Amadou Camara (top photos, visiting NAQAA CEO Dr Jaw) is a Gambian Academic and Consultant Ecologist now serving as Vice Chancellor for Euclid University in Gambia since the October 2019. Dr Camara was the Conservation Director of World Wide Fund (WWF) for Nature West Africa Marine Program Office (WWF WAMPO) from August 2013 to December 2014. As Conservation Director, he provided leadership and technical support for the development, implementation and monitoring and evaluation of WWF's conservation program in the West African Marine Eco-region. Dr Camara also served as Assistant Professor of Ecology at the University of the Gambia from 2011 to 2013. Dr Camara worked at the Department of Parks and Wildlife Management (DPWM) in The Gambia from the early 1990s to 2006. He started as a Temporary Conservation Assistant and rose through the ranks to the position of Senior Wildlife Conservation Officer in 2002. Dr Camara completed his undergraduate studies in Wildlife Management at the College of African Wildlife Management, in Mweka, Tanzania. He holds an MSc Degree in Desert Studies, specializing in the Ecology of Drylands, from the Albert Katz International School for Desert Studies, the Jacob Blaustein Institute for Desert Research, Ben-Gurion University of the Negev, in Israel. He received his PhD in Plant Community Ecology at the Department of Botany, University of Otago, in New Zealand. Dr Camara is also serving as Faculty Expert in Ecology and Climate Studies at EUCLID.

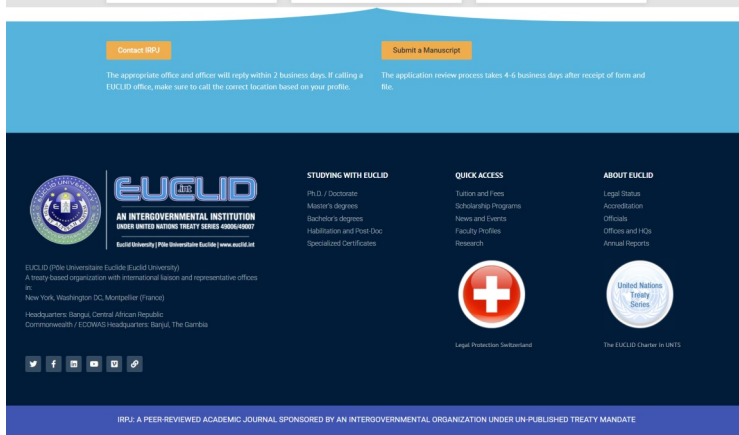
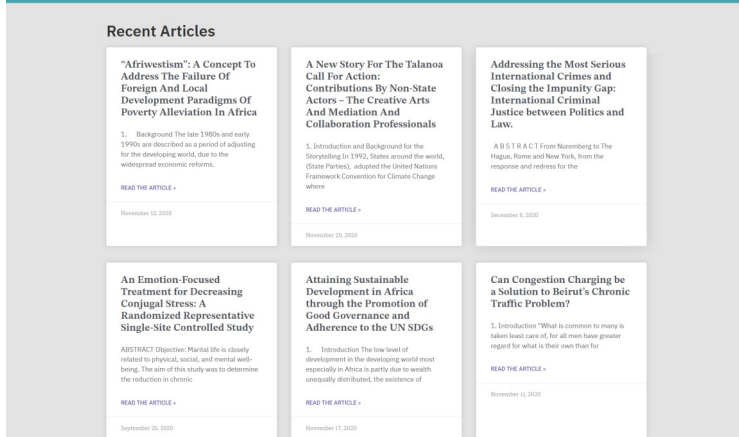
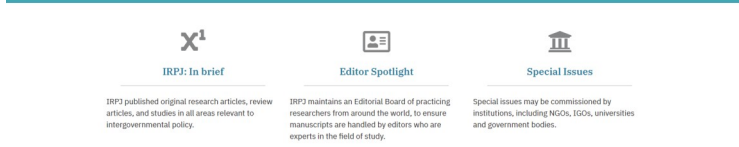
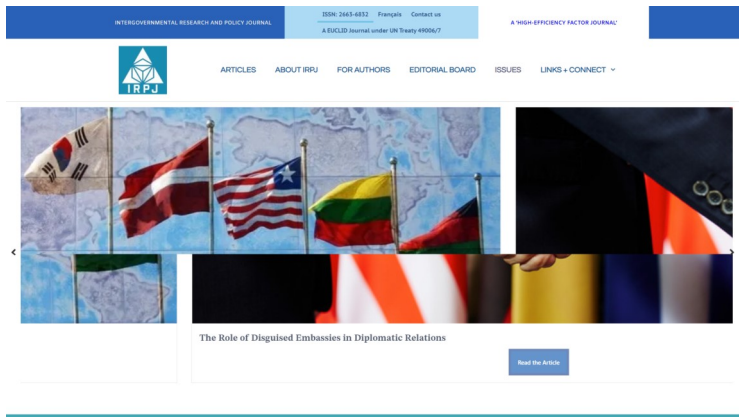


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IRPJ LAUNCH

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EUCLID ORGANIZATION IN 2020

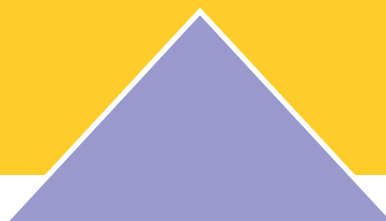
This section presents an overview of EUCLID's global organization and operations, with an organizational chart reflecting the Statutes, as well as details on global financial operations.

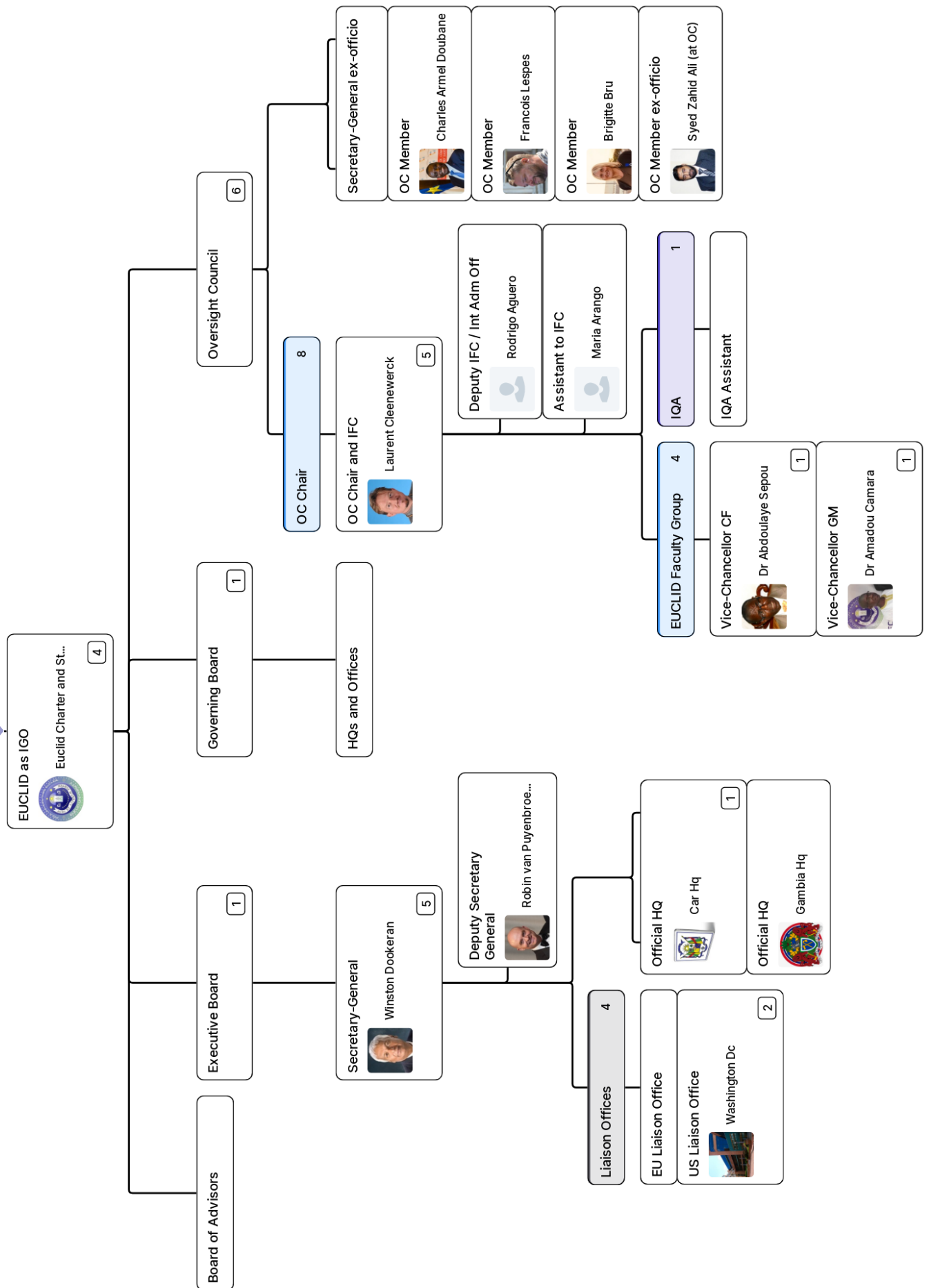

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KEY INDICATORS & FINANCES

EUCLID's income is primarily derived from tuition fees coming from general public students.

Thanks to its dedicated pool of volunteers and pro-bono experts which is a distinctive feature of the institution, EUCLID's staff overhead is reduced by 90%, from an estimated value of USD450,000 to an actual expense of less than USD50,000.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Not unlike the University of the People (celebrated for its tuition-free programs relying on pro-bono faculty members), EUCLID is exemplary for its amazing level of volunteer / pro-bono support at the senior official and faculty level. It is because our officials and faculty members are personally committed to the cause that EUCLID embodies that scholarships and very low-tuition programs can be offered. Where a typical US-based Master's degree typically costs USD40,000-USD60,000, a EUCLID program (with higher academic standards and best-of-class

LMS platform) is offered at less than USD7,000 (general public students without scholarships).

For accepted and paying students, the initial admission fee is set at USD850 and the cost per credit at USD145. This is the main source of revenue of the organization, and this revenue is collected directly through the Headquarters ECOBANK account (GMD/USD) as well as the EUCLID Global Institute accounts (Capital One / Bank of America) when the processing requires PayPal, credit card processing, and SWIFT

transfers.

In this regard, the EUCLID Global Institute is the legal instrument used by EUCLID and incorporated under EUCLID's own intergovernmental US Employer Identification Number.

As of fiscal years 2019 and 2020, EUCLID (Global Institute) uses Zoho Books online, AMR (accounting), and T. Pontes Certified Public Accountants (CPA) for accounting and tax filing services.

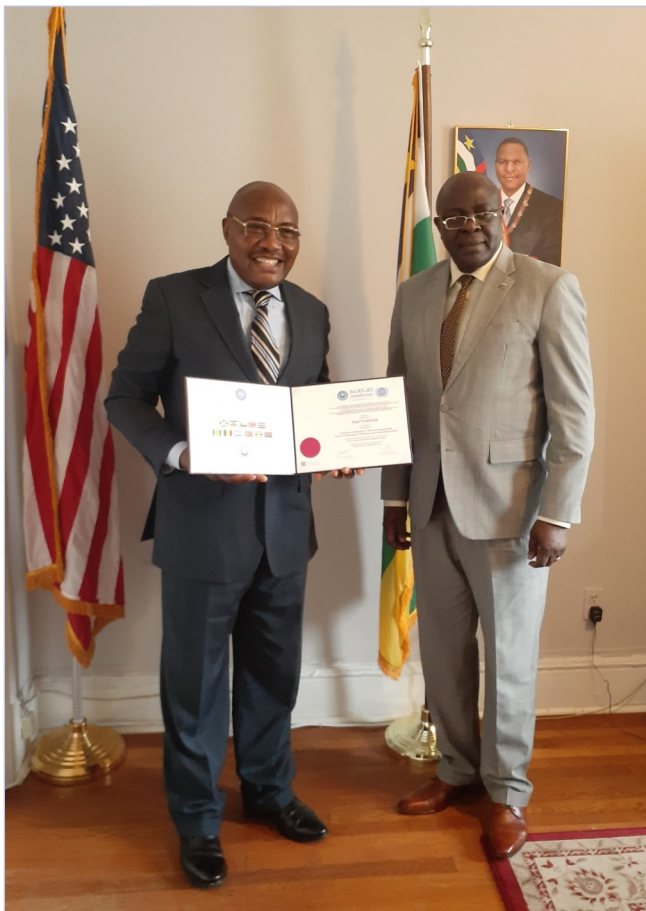
