A EUCLID Overview



EUCLID is a remarkable and unusual institution.

It is both a university and an intergovernmental organization.

Under our “intergovernmental organization” mandate, we provide important support services to our Participating States, including consultancy and e-government support.

Under our “intergovernmental university” mandate, we offer distance-learning programs in specific areas that correspond to our area of competencies. In doing so, we rely on an amazing faculty team which makes EUCLID a truly international university. Most of our instructors also work for other institutions and are willing to bring their expertise to contribution.

It is important to stress that our priority is to deliver flexible and recognized graduate-level programs to the staff of our Participating States. These are distance-learning programs that are built on the work accomplished by the Euclid Consortium in 2006 and 2007, and which led to the constitution of EUCLID as an intergovernmental university in 2008.

Our secondary priority is to support our Participating States in other areas where EUCLID has achieved competency and capacity, especially in e-government services.

Finally, EUCLID is authorized to allow general public students (notably from priority areas) to enroll in its programs, primarily for funding reasons. The number of general public students (who pay tuition) is deter-

mined to match both our faculty availability as well as our funding needs. At this point, it should also be said that our general public students are often diplomats or staff members for non-EUCLID States and intergovernmental organizations.

In general, our goal is to serve 5-15 government-sponsored students (we call them “participants” rather than students) per Participating State during one cycle. In some cases, our services to our Participating States are more focused on support services than on education—the key idea is that EUCLID is the creature of its constitutive text and supporting governments. It does not exist for itself but to be of service to its sponsoring governments and to the international community.

This dual aspect is more an asset and a strength than a liability, but we have found it necessary to engage in an educational effort to explain what intergovernmental universities are all about and how EUCLID is rightly structured to deliver on its mandate.

An amazing aspect of our organization is the interconnection between its African roots, its global faculty and management team, and the share of work being delivered by dedicated volunteers serving from all continents. Few “international universities” are as truly international as EUCLID is, and this is a source of inspiration and ever-renewed energy to excel. Consider joining our team in 2016!

Major Developments and Events

In April 2015, EUCLID celebrated 7 years of service as an intergovernmental organization and international university.

2015 was marked by the gradual strengthening of EUCLID's HQ operations in The Gambia as well as the signature of joint degree programs agreements with two other intergovernmental organizations, CAFRAD and COMESA-LLPI.

CAFRAD AND EUCLID

April 2015: EUCLID and CAFRAD sign Memorandum of Understanding and launch Joint Degree Program

The EUCLID Secretary General, Mr Syed ZAHID ALI announced the signature of two agreements with CAFRAD, an intergovernmental organization serving 36 Member States with a mandate in Public Administration. The two organizations will now offer a joint MPA program specialized in International Public Administration to support capacity building and higher education options in the sector. CAFRAD is the main regional partner of the United Nations Public Administration Network (UNPAN).

March 2015: EUCLID and COMESA-LLPI sign umbrella Memorandum of Understanding

The EUCLID Secretary General, Mr Syed ZAHID ALI announced the signature of an umbrella Memorandum of Understanding with COMESA-LLPI, an intergovernmental organization serving 9 Member States and affiliated to COMESA, the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa. The two organizations will, in this framework, develop a joint MBA program in Leather Commerce of Industry to support capacity building and economic development in the sector.

As a side event, COMESA LLPI's Executive Director, Dr. Mwinyikione MWINYIHIJA, joined EUCLID's faculty corps.

International Public Health Programs

2015 was marked by the Ebola crisis, a tragedy which especially West African and one of EUCLID's founding Participating States, Sierra Leone. This crisis coincided with EUCLID's ongoing reflection on academic service to its stakeholders, and the announcement in 2014 that EUCLID would be developing two distance learning programs in international public health / global health.

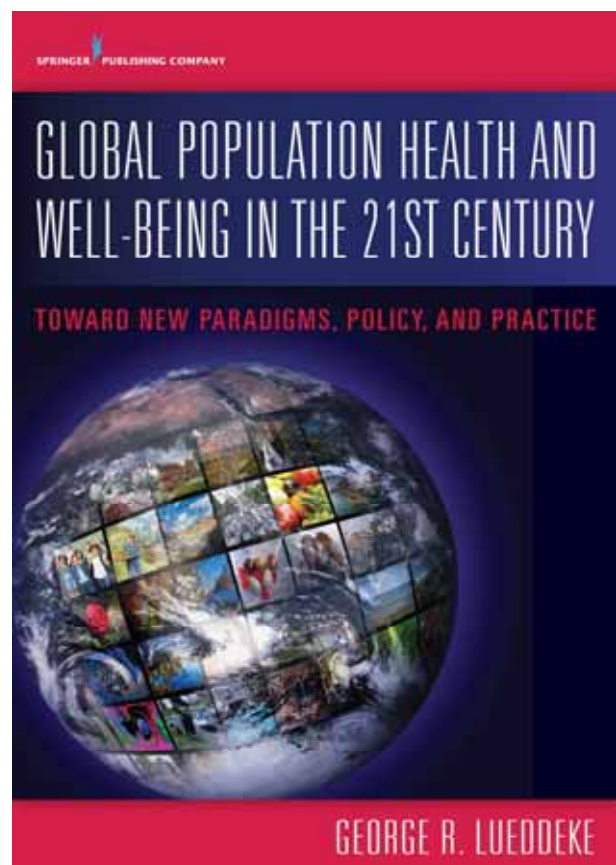

EUCLID (Euclid University) was admitted to GRLI membership in July 2015 and is eager to bring its distinctive background and attributes to expand and support the GRLI network. EUCLID is an intergovernmental university established by a United Nations registered treaty in 2008, whose principal mandate is to train government officials employed by its member states. The institution has its operational offices in Greater Banjul, the capital of The Gambia (West Africa) with the support of both the Ministry of Higher Education and Ministry of Foreign Affairs which both approved the institution's headquarters agreement.

EUCLID currently serves twelve Participating States in the Global South, spanning from Vanuatu in the South Pacific to Saint Vincent in the Caribbean and Timor-Leste in Southeast Asia, with a special service area on the African continent where it has 8 member states.

With its distinctive ".int" domain reserved for treaty-based institutions, EUCLID is a specialized institution that has something distinctive to offer in terms of globalized higher education: an approach of global responsibility that speaks to the Global South by integrating the diversity of moral, ethical and religious values into a formal academic framework.

After 7 years of service to its stakeholders, EUCLID is now seeing its graduates evolve at various levels of international civil service and global responsibility, including one current ambassador to France and UNESCO, one under-minister in charge of international aid for his country, a Head for West and Central Africa for the British Cross, and a sustainable development officer for the government of New Zealand among others.

In addition to this primary mandate to train officials for specific governments, EUCLID also

EUCLID Expertise at Work

EUCLID can boast a truly global and distributed faculty corps of more than 70 experts located across all continents. EUCLID's faculty members are also noted for their publication record, for which Euclid University Press is a powerful vector. In 2015, EUCLID's most significant publication was a new textbook / handbook on binding and non-binding instruments, a topic of great relevance in view of the discussion that surround the COP21 Paris Accord.

"Binding and Non-Binding" is a much needed and anticipated guide written by experts for an audience of diplomats and specialists in international relations. It answers seemingly simple (but tricky) questions, such as "what is a treaty?" "what is ratification?" and "how can I tell if an international instrument is binding (a treaty) or not?"

This book also tackles the difficult issue of the "MOU vs Treaty" classification which is extremely confusing and often leads to grave misunderstandings.

Written in a dynamic style with many practical examples, "Binding and Non-Binding" should be on the desk of every government official and legal analyst involved in diplomacy and global affairs. Published at the time when negotiated instruments are often misunderstood (The Copenhagen Accord, The Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action between the P5+1 and Iran), this authoritative textbook is a welcome instance of practical and approachable academic publishing.

About the authors:

The authors are faculty members and subject-matter experts at EUCLID (Euclid University), an intergovernmental university commissioned to train diplomats and officials for its Participating States as well as to provide expertise to the international community. Among the authors, Mark Scully served for seven years as Executive Officer in the Treaties Secretariat of the Australian government's Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade from July 2003 until 27 August 2010.

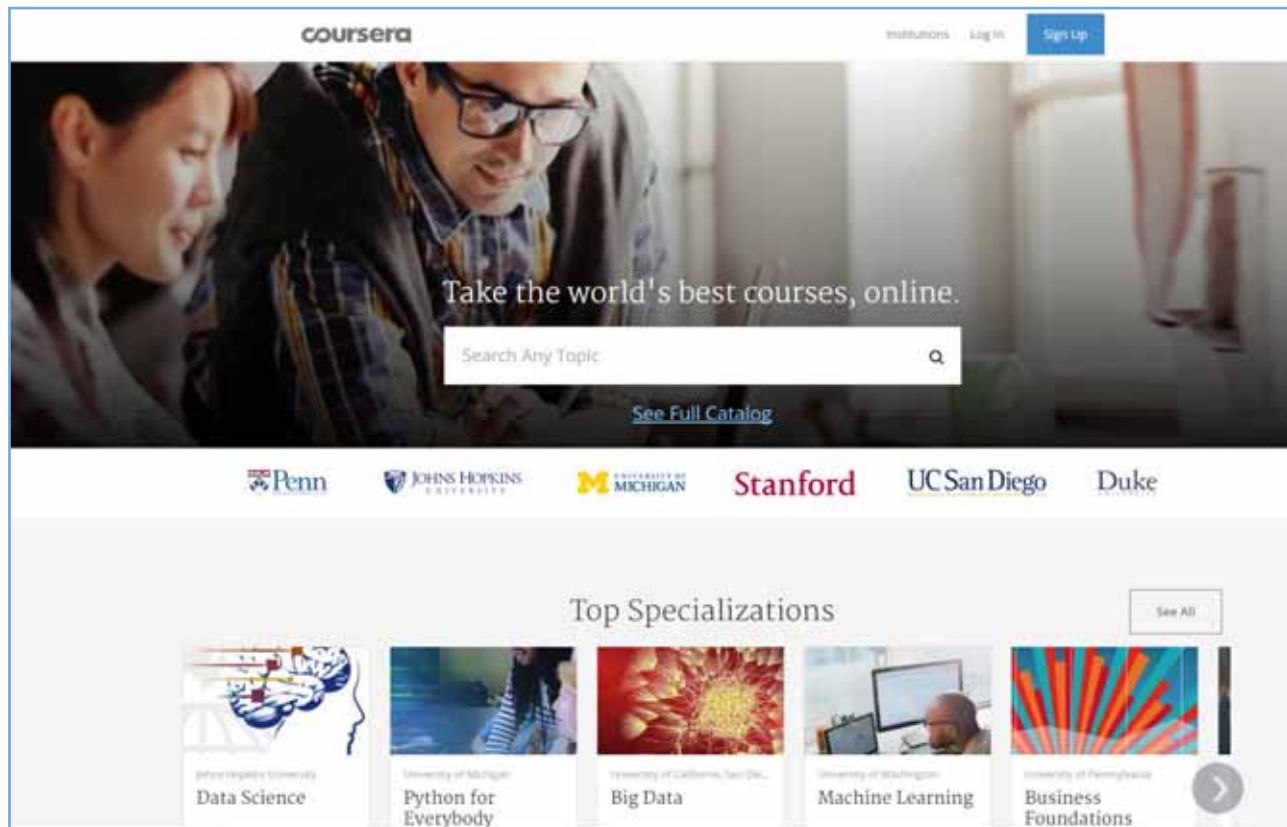

EUCLID's LMS goes live

Until 2015, EUCLID delivered its courses using a combination of in-house technologies (ELEMENT v1 platform) and cloud-based services (Egnyte e-library, Vimeo). After 6 months of intense R&D, EUCLID announced that its new LMS platform would go live on January 1, 2016, and that it would be inspired by the world's best-of-class proprietary and open platforms, notably Coursera.

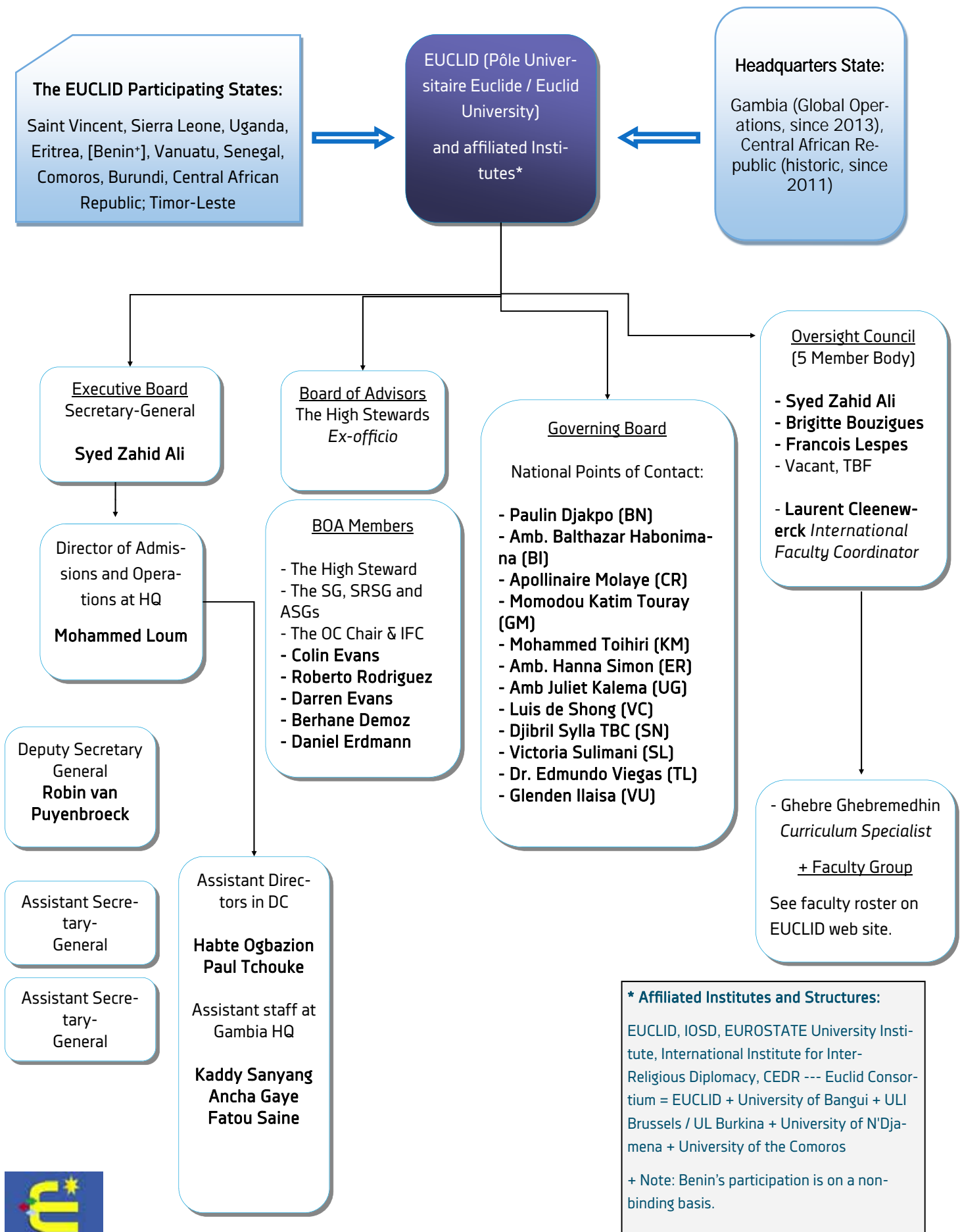

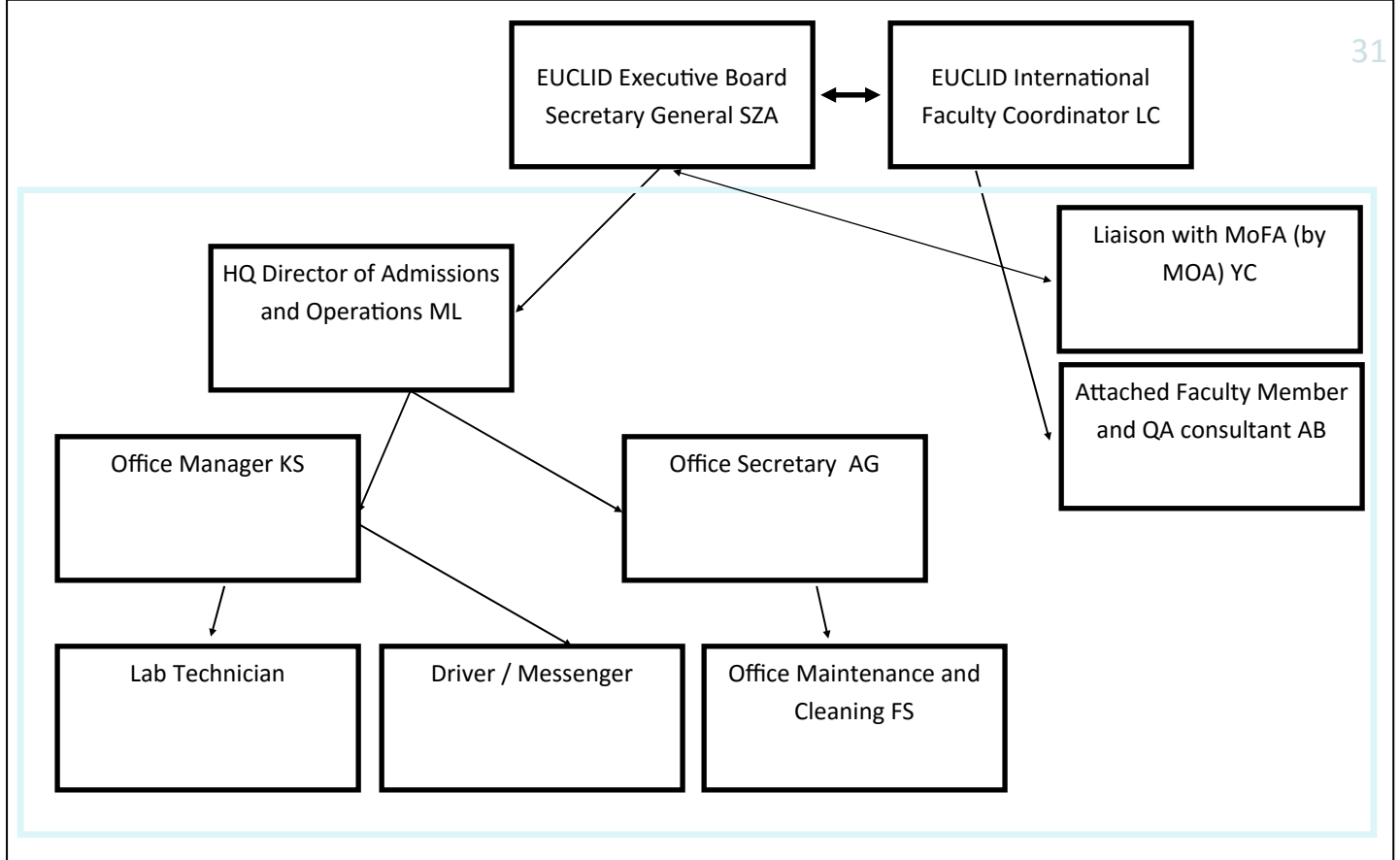

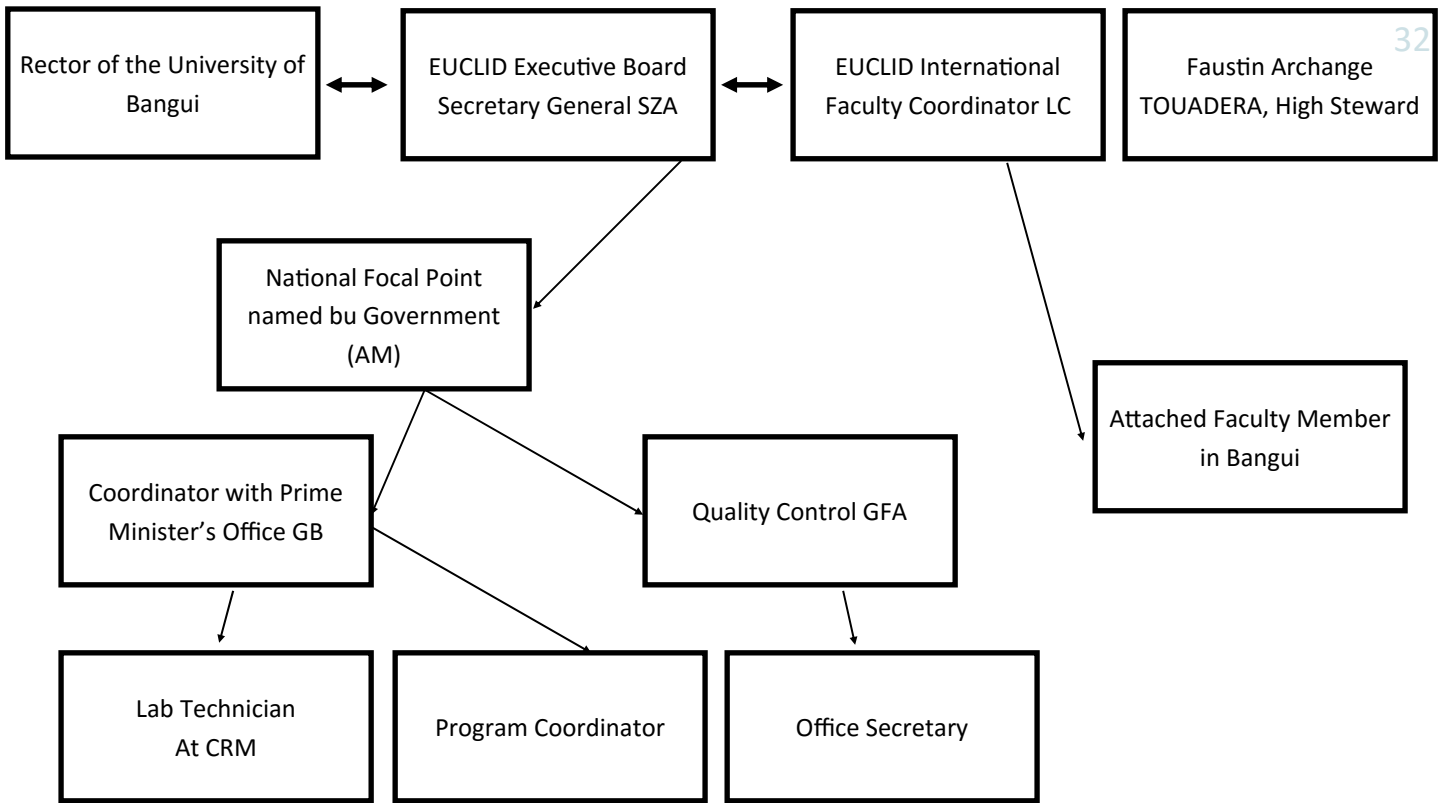

Metrics and Indicators

EUCLID's income is primarily derived from tuition fees coming from general public students.

Thanks to its dedicated pool of volunteers and pro-bono experts which is a distinctive feature of the institution, EUCLID's staff overhead is reduced by 90%, from an actual value of USD250,000 to an actual expense of less than USD50,000.

Financial Reports

Not unlike the University of the People (celebrated for its tuition-free programs relying on pro-bono faculty members), EUCLID is exemplary for its amazing level of volunteer / pro-bono support at the senior official and faculty level. It is because our officials and faculty members are personally committed to the cause that EUCLID embodies that scholarships and very low-tuition programs can be offered. Where a typical US-based Master's degree typically costs USD40,000-USD60,000, a EUCLID program (with higher academic

standards and best-of-class LMS platform) is offered at less than USD7,000 (general public students without scholarships).

For accepted and paying students, the initial admission fee is set at USD850 and the cost per credit at USD145. This is the main source of revenue of the organization, and this revenue is collected directly through the Headquarters ECOBANK account (GMD/USD) as well as the EUCLID Global Institute accounts (Capital One / Bank of America) when the processing re-

quires PayPal, credit card processing, and SWIFT transfers.

In this regards, the EUCLID Global Institute is the legal instrument used by EUCLID and incorporated under EUCLID's own inter-governmental US Employer Identification Number.

Both EUCLID/HQ and the EUCLID Global Institute use QuickBooks online and Trident (Accounting) Overseas for accounting services.
